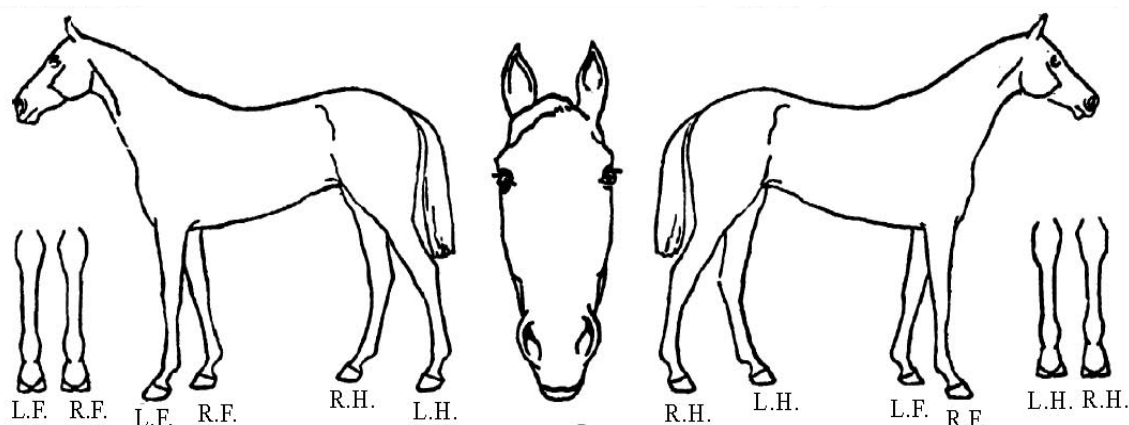

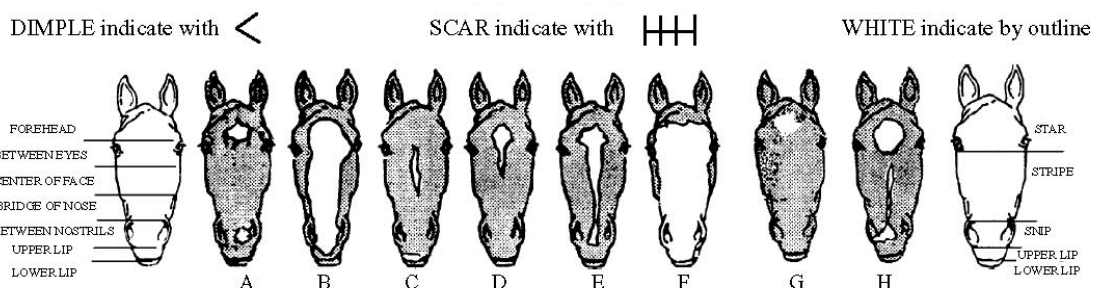

A-irregular star, snip extending into left nostril.
B-blaze, touching left eye, extending into both nostrils
C-narrow stripe, starting between eyes & ending on bridge of nose, white upper lip right side.
D- star, connected narrow strip ending in centre of face.

E-irregular star, connected strip narrowing on bridge of nose, connected snip ending below nostril.
F-bald face.
G-bordered irregular star.
H-large round star, broken strip, connected snip extending into right nostril.

BLACK - entire coat including muzzle, flanks and legs must be black with the exception of white markings.

DARK BAY OR BROWN - entire coat is brown with areas of tan on the head, shoulder, inside thighs & upper portions of legs. Mane, tail & lower portion of the legs are black unless white markings are present.

BAY - entire coat varies from a yellow-tan to a bright auburn. The mane, tail & also lower portion of legs are always black, unless white markings are present.

CHESTNUT - entire coat varies from a yellow-red to a red-yellow to a golden yellow. The mane, tail & legs are also red (same colour as the coat).

GREY - coat is a mixture of black & white hair. In the young horse, black hair predominates but as the horse ages white hair increases and markings tend to fade. May have white markings.

ROAN - coat is a mixture of red & white hair. In the young horse the red hair predominates but as he ages, the white hair increases. If the red hair comes from the chestnut pattern, the mane, tail and legs will be red. If the red comes from a bay, the mane, tail and legs will be black. May have white markings
